## General Information

All K-12 teachers in Maui County are invited to participate in the annual Maui Fair School Art Exhibit. Teachers may participate by submitting student artwork and assisting with the installation and take down of the exhibit.

<u>Window for Entries:</u> Monday - Wednesday, **September 25 – 27, 2017** (<u>No Late Entries</u>)

Installation of Exhibit: Monday, October 2, 2017 – Starting at 3:00 pm War Memorial Gym

Exhibition: Thursday – Sunday, October 5-8, 2017

Please advise students/parents <u>not</u> to pick up or take artwork on Sunday night. All work should be picked up on Monday (see below) by the teacher or school/parent representative.

\*\*\*<mark>Take Down and Pick up Entries: Monday, October 9, 2017 (8:00-9:30 a.m.)</mark>

(Teachers: If you cannot participate on Monday with the take down and pick up of entries, please send a school representative or a volunteer parent to pick them up.)

\* There will be two categories: Two-Dimensional (2-D) and Three-Dimensional (3-D)

Each student will be limited to one entry per category (1 entry for 2D & 1 entry for 3D maximum; THIS INCLUDES COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS).

(Additional works by the same student in same category will be disqualified.)

Please Note: Envelopes with cash prizes and complimentary entry tickets for student winners will be passed out to teachers/school representatives during the installation of the exhibit on Monday, October 2, 2017 in the War Memorial Gym. Otherwise prizes will remain at the fair trailer for pick-up until Friday, Oct. 13, 2017 thereafter prizes will be forfeited.

## School Art Exhibit Guidelines (Conditions and Regulations):

- 1. Participating students must be currently enrolled in school (K-12) within the Maui District.
- 2. All entries will be considered for judging at the student's CURRENT GRADE LEVEL.
- 3. Artwork should be produced between November 2016 September 2017
- 4. Artwork should be produced in the classroom or as an extension of the classroom teaching. It should reflect the student's best efforts with <u>minimal adult assistance</u>.
- 5. Entries may be in any medium (exceptions: no photography, video, computer graphics, mobiles, quilts, or artwork made from food products). Make sure all pieces are intact and secure.
- 6. Teachers should select a variety of artwork as opposed to submitting many from the same assignment. If there are several from the same assignment, only one artwork may be displayed.
- 7. There will be no more work accepted for any reason after judging is complete. Work that has not been judged will not be displayed.
- 8. All participating schools must send at least one teacher/representative for the installation and the breakdown of the exhibit.

# <u>Two-Dimensional Matting and Labeling (Pieces that do not meet mat border and/or labeling requirements will not be judged or displayed):</u>

- 1. <u>Divisions I, II & III:</u> All 2-D entries must be matted or mounted with mat board, rail road board, poster board, or oak tag. *Limit mat size to no wider than 2" borders on all 4 sides.*
- 2. Division IV & V: All 2-D entries must be matted with mat board or white oak tag.

No wood, glass, or metal frames. Limit mat size to no wider than 3" borders on all 4 sides.

- 3. <u>Canvas work is allowed for Division IV & V only but must be installed with hanging wire.</u>

  <u>Teacher must be present to hang piece</u>. Any work posing a problem with installation will not be displayed.
- 4. Matted or mounted size should not exceed 28", length or width (due to space limitations).
- 5. Attach labels to the <u>front</u>, lower right corner of the mat:
  - Use the attached labels <u>or</u> make your own labels (you must include the same information).
  - Labels should not extend off the mat.
  - All labels must be typed or neatly printed.
  - Optional for Division IV and V: You may include type of media and title of artwork on the label.

### <u>Three-Dimensional Matting and Labeling:</u>

- 1. The size of 3-D artworks should not exceed 26", length, width or depth (due to space limitations).
- Any work posing a problem with installation will not be displayed. Extremely
  fragile/delicate pieces must be delivered to judging and installed by the teacher. ART WORK THAT IS
  BROKEN WILL NOT BE DISPLAYED. PLEASE CONTACT COORDINATING TEACHERS FOR JUDGING INFO.
- 3. Use the attached labels <u>or</u> make your own labels (you must include the same information).
- 4. All labels must be typed or neatly printed.
- 5. Attach labels to a 3" x 5" index card strung with string and securely fastened to each 3-D entry.
- 6. Also, write the student's name and school on masking tape and secure it to the bottom of all 3-D pieces.
- 7. Optional for Division V and VI: You may include type of media and title of artwork on the label.

Artwork that is <u>NOT</u> labeled or properly matted will <u>NOT</u> be displayed.

All entrants enter their artwork in this exhibit at their own risk. The Maui Fair will not assume any responsibility for loss, damage, or breakage of submitted artwork.

Unclaimed artwork will be stored at the Maui Fair office/trailer for 5 days.

If the artwork is not claimed by Friday, October 13, 2017 it will be disposed of.
